

Short bio

Marco Armiero (born in Naples in 1966) is an ICREA Research Professor at the Institute for the History of Science, Autonomous University of Barcelona. Prof. Armiero is a truly global scholar, with a highly international career spanning diverse continents and prestigious institutions. He was a postdoctoral fellow at Yale University and Stanford, a visiting scholar at Berkeley and Coimbra in Portugal, and a recipient of the prestigious Barron Visiting Professorship at Princeton (declined). For ten years, he directed the KTH Environmental Humanities Laboratory, making this academic institution a global hub for research and dissemination activities that brought the humanities to the forefront of the current mobilization on the socioecological crisis. Through his numerous publications, Prof. Armiero has been influential in diverse fields and beyond academia. During his career, Prof. Armiero has combined highly prestigious achievements with a passionate commitment to working with disenfranchised communities while fostering environmental, social, and narrative justice.

In 2021, Cambridge University Press published his book "Wasteocene: Stories from the Global Dump", which made a significant contribution to the current debate on the so-called Anthropocene. The book became a point of reference for scholars and community organizers all over the world; it has been translated into Italian, Spanish, Bosniac-Croatian-Serbian, French, and Chinese, while the Portuguese and Indonesian translations are currently under production. In 2022, Renmin University in China hosted a symposium dedicated to this book, while Italian Public Television dedicated a 30-minute show to it. In the same year, he published with two former students the first environmental history of Italian fascism, initially in Italian and then translated into English by MIT Press and into Spanish by Comares. In 2023 he published a book *La tragedia Vajont. Ecologia politica di un disastro* (Einaudi), translated by MIT Press (2026).

Prof. Armiero is, above all, a pioneer. He is among the founders of environmental history in Europe; he is acknowledged to have started a research line on the environmental history of migrations, and his contribution to the establishment of the environmental humanities is well recognized, as evidenced by the number of invited talks he receives. Concepts such as Wasteocene, toxic narrative infrastructure, and fascist political ecologies have become building blocks of new scholarships. His success in terms of grants and academic achievements has been an example for younger generations of scholars because Prof. Armiero has proved that one can succeed without renouncing their radical points of view.
