I am an [ICREA](#) Research Professor at the [Institute of Environmental Science and Technology](#), Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (ICTA-UAB), where I lead the [Laboratory for the Analysis of Social-Ecological Systems](#) (LASEG). I am a political ecologist building knowledge on how ‘sustainable’ land-use management programs impact livelihoods, resource management institutions and people’s behavior, mostly in the “global majority” countries. My research has been instrumental to understand the implications of these ‘sustainable’ land-use programs for rural people and to draw policy recommendations.

I have examined the environmental and socio-economic outcomes of carbon forestry offsets, Payments for Ecosystem Services (PES), and the UN-Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Degradation initiative (REDD+), with special emphasis on justice considerations. I have also discerned people’s motivations to engage or reject such initiatives and identified the potential for motivational crowding. I have also investigated the effects of conservation policy and agricultural intensification on farmers’ vulnerability, and I have shed light on the institutional and gendered biases in the production of climate change and ecosystem services knowledge. Research findings have so far translated into more than 120 peer-reviewed scientific articles, several book chapters, dozens of policy briefs, working papers and consultancy reports.

I have conducted or coordinated fieldwork in several countries, including Mexico, Tanzania, Colombia, Nepal, Vietnam and Argentina, leading data collection teams for several research projects. I have participated in 18 projects as either Principal Investigator (PI) or Co-Investigator, through which I have managed over €7 million directly as PI. I have trained doctoral and pre-doctoral researchers in qualitative and quantitative data collection, guided 14 PhD dissertations to completion (+ 5 ongoing) and mentored 10 early career post-docs. I have been a speaker in over 75 international conferences, workshops and policy events, a reviewer for international research programs and journals, as well as a consultant for organizations like the Spanish, Swedish and Dutch Research Agencies, the Center for International Forestry Research, UNESCO, and the Catalan government.

My teaching addresses topics in political ecology, ecological economics and the social dimensions of climate change and biodiversity conservation, mostly at postgraduate level. I lectured at the University of East Anglia (2002-2011), the University of Cambridge (2009-2011), the *Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals* (IBEI) (2017-2024) and ICTA-UAB (2011-ongoing). I have served the wider public and academic community in various ways: as scientific and deputy director of ICTA-UAB (2019-2025), as associate or subject editor of journals like *Geoforum* (2017-2021) and *Ecology and Society* (2021-ongoing), and as a PhD examiner or member of faculty appointment committees, science-policy boards, and prize committees. Spanish and Catalan are my mother tongues, and I’m proficient in English and fluent in Italian and less so in French.
