I launched the (B)OrderS Centre in 2021-22 as inaugural Director with a full programme of public and internal activities. Membership is multidisciplinary, comprising Faculty, ECRs, PhD candidates, and external affiliates. The core thematic interest is on the study of (b)ordering and othering processes through law. The ambition is to become an excellence hub across

disciplines, providing **avenues for impact**, **shaping future policy and research agendas** in response to global challenges. 1 ECR (Dr Busuttil, SOAS) and 1 PhD candidate (Allde, QMUL) act as assistant coordinators, which constitutes an opportunity for **academic development**. **Mentoring** is an important part of the Centre's ethos. Once per term, we hold **work-in-progress sessions** where PhDs / ECRs present their research and obtain feedback from a peer and a more senior colleague. • SHARED PROJECT (2022-24)

The <u>SHARED Project: Shared Responsibility for Human Rights at the EU External Border</u> (2022-24) that I lead as PI is funded by a **consortium of academic and non-academic partners**, including the (B)OrderS Centre, the Institute of Public Law (IDP) (\in 3,000) and the Interdisciplinary Research Group on Migration (GESDI) of the University of Barcelona (\in 2,000), and the offices of six Members of the **European Parliament**: Tineke Strik & Erik Marquardt (Greens), Cornelia Ernst & Malin Björk (The Left), and Birgit Sippel & Juan Fernando López Aguilar (Chair) (S&D) (\in 15,000 jointly).The project launched in January 2023 with a <u>call for papers</u> that attracted over 100 proposals. SAROBMED PROJECT (2017-19)

SAROBMED: The Search and Rescue Observatory for the Mediterranean (2017-19) was established as an interdisciplinary, multi-stakeholder, trans-national collaboration of (16) academic researchers and (15) civil society actors to document and investigate human rights violations against "boat migrants" and NGOs undertaking rescue at sea. Results have led to multiple publications resulting from the analysis of the incidents recorded, appearances at international conferences, evidence given at national and international institutions, and strategic litigation initiated on the basis of the material collected. The project outputs include articles in the Journal of Common Market Studies, the German Law Journal, and The Oxford Handbook of International Refugee Law, and a database documenting nearly 100 cases of human rights violations perpetrated at sea in the course, or as a result, of interdiction / rescue operations, witnessed directly by civil society organisations, since the outbreak of the "refugee crisis". The project received funding by the Queen Mary HSS Strategic Impact (£15,000) and Engagement funds (£3,000), and the European Parliament (€35,000) [recipient of 2019 QMUL Engagement Award: <u>"Interact" category</u>].
